## 9.3 Whole steps

A whole step is equivalent to two half steps. On the piano, it is the distance between two keys that have one key in between them. Here are some examples.



For each pair of pitches, name the notes. Then check your keyboard sheet to determine whether they are a half step apart from each other, a whole step apart, or *enharmonic pitches*. **ENHARMONIC** notes are two notes that are written differently but that sound the same pitch.



Melodic dictation: Write down the remaining notes in the melody. HINT: This will move by stepwise motion.
